Your request to terminate the permit equivalency (2450E) is in the process of being processed. The dilemma is that the pumps are still in the wells and must be removed to below a 70gpm capacity. In other words, one 50gpm pump can remain if necessary, but it is not recommended. Mr. Arandosky (HRS drilling) is a certified pump remover and may be able to provide immediate assistance if still on site.

Send an email once the pumps are removed from well permit #2500035857 through 2500035861 (aka. wells one through 5) and 2500059202 (aka. well-4A). A picture of the pumps lying on the ground once removed, with a scale for reference, is also nice.

Once this email is received, permit 2450E will be terminated.
